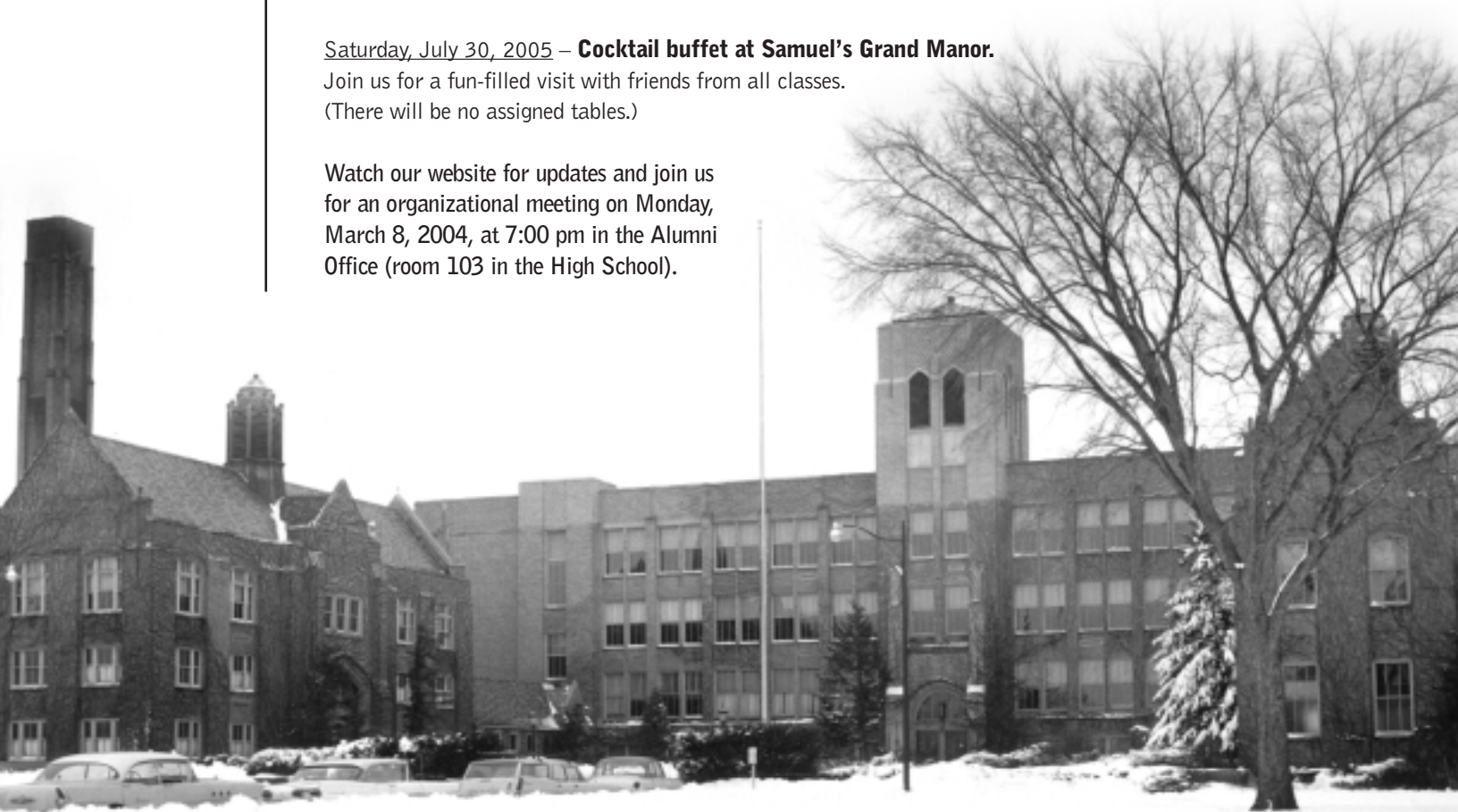

Buy a Brick to Light the Athletic Field

The Amherst Tigers Booster Club, a volunteer parent organization dedicated to supporting all athletes on every Amherst High School sports team, would like to remind everyone of their ongoing Amherst Schools Brick Donor Walkway fundraising campaign to purchase NCAA sanctioned lights for the athletic field/8 lane all weather track area, recently renovated through the efforts of the Amherst Central Alumni Foundation, Inc.

This is a community project to set your legacy in stone, which needs the support of parents, alumni, staff, administration and business owners of our school district. If you're a business owner, by purchasing a brick, you're afforded the opportunity to showcase your business. The beauty of this project is that it enables us to make a major improvement to the school grounds without impacting tax dollars.

Our brick pathway will encircle the High School courtyard flagpole and is visible to everyone entering the school. A formal dedication will be held on Saturday, May 22, 2004.

Alumni Foundation Funds Two New Grants

On November 15th, the Amherst High School Concert Chorale traveled to Ithaca College to participate in a High School Choir Competition/Workshop; a trip made possible, in part, by an \$800 donation from the Alumni Foundation to defray transportation costs. With only six other high schools statewide in the prestigious invitational, the 64-member choir participated under direction of Michael Lippert, Director of Choral and Vocal Music. Students attended workshops with composers and college faculty and performed with other high schools and the Ithaca College Choir.

The Foundation has also recently committed to provide a grant of \$500 to the Success For Students Programs at Amherst Middle School. The program assists students who are struggling academically and who benefit by a point system designed to reward attendance, good behavior, staying after school for extra help and completing homework. That's where the Alumni Foundation comes in – its grant will fund the rewards (field trips and other incentives) earned by successful students. In nine years of operation, this program boasts a 95% success rate measured by grade improvement, parental involvement, attendance and respectful behavior.
