New Doors for Amherst High School!



During Amherst High's 75th Anniversary, hundreds of graduates not only gathered to celebrate this once in a lifetime occasion, but also raised thousands of dollars to present a very special gift to our high school – a pair of beautiful oak doors for the main entrance. These custom-made doors are replicas of those built 75 years ago; returning the front of the building back to its original design.

Through the generous donations of many alumni and friends, installation of these new doors took place this past September. On November 2, 2006, during Amherst's Homecoming week, members of the ACAF, Inc., Amherst Central School District Administration and Board of Education President, William Blanford, gathered for a special dedication ceremony. Representing the Alumni Foundation, Virginia Fretz Rusk '71, President, formally presented the gift to Amherst High School Principal, Jo Ann Balazs. During a concert later that evening, Mrs. Balazs acknowledged and thanked members of the Alumni Foundation for their gift. A beautiful photograph of the new doors, taken by students Austin Borek and Sarah Hunt, was presented to the ACAF, Inc. as a token of appreciation for the alumni's generosity.

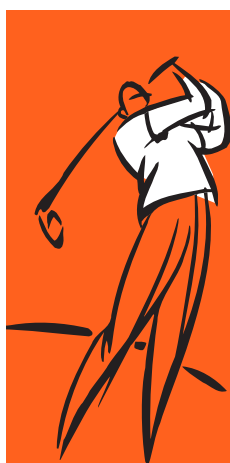

RETIRED TEACHER RECEIVES DISTINGUISHED AWARD

Dr. Peter E. Demmin received the ACAF, Inc. 2006 Distinguished Educator Emeritus Award at a dinner buffet and reception on September 27, 2006.

Peter Demmin was a chemistry teacher at Amherst Central High School for his entire teaching career, from 1959 to 1995, and served as chairman of the school's science department from 1968-1994.

At the March 6th meeting of the Amherst Central School Board of Education, President William Blanford announced the selection of

Laura K. Chabe to serve as the Superintendent of the Amherst Central School District upon the retirement of Superintendent Dennis Ford in June, 2007.

Ms. Chabe, who currently serves as the Superintendent of Westfield Academy and Central School District, is a 1982 graduate of the State University of New York at Fredonia. Ms. Chabe comes to Amherst with a distinguished career in education that spans over 20 years. Prior

to serving as Superintendent, Ms. Chabe served four years as an elementary principal for Westfield; four years in administration and eight years as a special education teacher in the Fredonia Central School District; and three years as a special education teacher in the Liberty Central School District. Ms. Chabe earned her certificate in administration from SUNY Fredonia and her masters in special education from SUNY Albany. She is currently pursuing her doctorate in Educational Leadership and Policy from the State University of Buffalo.

The appointment of Ms. Chabe follows a five month search by the Amherst Board of Education. Mr. Blanford indicated that the district received input through a series of focus groups comprised of individuals from both inside and outside the district,

and the Board of Education is grateful for the participation of the stakeholders. The selection process was conducted on a confidential basis to ensure participation from numerous qualified candidates. The search was conducted by Dr. Vincent Coppola of the Western New York Educational Service Council at the State University of Buffalo.

Dennis Ford's retirement will mark the completion of a successful career in education that spans over 33 years, with the last 11 years serving as Superintendent of Amherst. Speaking for the Board of Education, Mr. Blanford took this opportunity to recognize and express their "deep appreciation for the strength, leadership and vision that Dennis Ford has contributed to our children and our entire district."
