

2008 EDUCATOR EMERITUS RECIPIENTS

Four educators receive distinguished Amherst Alumni award

The Amherst Central Alumni Foundation, Inc. honored its 2008 Distinguished Educator Emeritus Award winners at a reception October 23, 2008 at Samuel's Grande Manor. This year's recipients included:

Janette Atkinson, former chairman of the English department at Amherst High School from 1972-1976.

According to colleagues and former students, Atkinson, who is now deceased, was far more than an advisor; she was a chauffeur, counselor, cook, typist and friend. Although she encouraged independence, she was always ready to assist, serving as a mentor to fellow English teachers. Mrs. Atkinson was also a faculty advisor to the school's award winning newspaper, The Tatler.

Thomas Davis, former principal of Harlem Road Elementary School from 1954-1976, and longtime member of the Amherst Lion's Club and Amherst Male Glee Club.

Among Mr. Davis's proudest accomplishments were his outdoor educational curriculum, and elementary school program, which involved students switching classes for different subjects.

Werner "Whitey" Huber, history teacher at the Amherst Middle School and community volunteer in Elma, NY.

Mr. Huber taught at Amherst Middle School from 1965-1994 and is remembered for his passion for teaching and his strong opinions on issues. Mr. Huber, who has Parkinson's Disease, recently had a walking trail in Elma's Village Green Park named in his honor.

David Ulrich who taught in Amherst High School's history department from 1969-2007.

Mr. Ulrich taught AP level history for 23 years and chaired the history department from 1984-2007 before retiring. Mr. Ulrich also was the President of the Amherst Education Association, most recently from 1993-2007. Since retiring, Mr. Ulrich has been travelling, and is currently studying Chinese and Arabic and taking a course in Caribbean Literature. He is also training to be a docent at the art gallery.

In Memoriam

DONALD (DIMP) WAGNER '48

The Alumni Foundation and the entire Amherst Central School District were deeply saddened to learn of Donald (Dimp) Wagner's passing on January 29, 2009.

Dimp's continuous generosity to the school district is legendary among the students, faculty, staff, administrators, parents and alumni. Donald R. Wagner, class of 1948, was the largest contributor to ACAF's Alumni Field Capital Campaign. The field is named in his honor.



Dimp was president of the National Honor Society and voted Athlete-Scholar of the Class of 1948. He participated in the marching band, symphony and choir. He was captain and quarterback of the football team with two undefeated seasons. In addition, Don spent three years on the varsity basketball and track teams – both of which were Section VI champions his senior year. He was also a graduate of Dartmouth College with a BA and an MBA from the Tuck College School of Business.

After school, he served two years in the U.S. Army and tried his hand at several businesses before joining his brother's contractor's supply company, John Wagner Associates (Grabber).

At the time of the 75th reunion in 2005, Dimp wrote the following greeting:

"Be grateful for your education, your teachers, your coaches, your mentors, your friends and the scholarly conditioning you enjoyed at Amherst. These were the ignition for growing into the future where truly you evolved as a productive citizen being a member of a family and community where ever you settled. You are lucky indeed! Our presence here today is a testimony to our good fortune. Where ever we go or have been we have left a trail. It's indisputable! May you honor Amherst Central High School with a high spirited reunion of reminiscence, conversation, sharing and good old fashioned joy."

Dimp is survived by his wife, Loveday (Anne) of Annapolis, MD, brother, John Brad (Judy), and his sister Barbara (Bob) Spillane and many nieces and nephews.

ELENORA V. HILDEBRAND

Elenora Hildebrand, age 95, retired home economics teacher in the High School, passed away on April 3, 2009. She was a long time honorary member of the Amherst Central Alumni Foundation, Inc. Elenora always volunteered to sell raffle tickets at the annual golf outing and she loved to tell stories of faculty and students that needed “emergency clothing repairs.”



Elenora taught in Blasdell and Medina prior to spending 27 years teaching at ACHS. She was class adviser to the classes of 1953 and 1965, and also made the costumes for all students involved in the school's operettas for 13 years. She retired in 1973.

In addition to her involvement with the ACAF, Elenora was active in the NYS Home Economics Association, Amherst Retired Teachers, Delta Sigma Epsilon, Embroiders Guild and the St. Aloysius senior citizens organizations.

JAMES WHITMORE '40

James Whitmore, the veteran Tony and Emmy Award winning actor who brought American icons Will Rogers, Harry Truman and Theodore Roosevelt to life in one-man shows, died on February 6, 2009. He attended School 18 and Amherst Central High School through 11th grade. While attending ACHS, James was a member of the Tatler staff and Boys Chorus; played Tom Williams in the junior play “Going on 17”, Lord Chancellor in the operetta “...iolanthe”, and was a star player on the football team. The 1938 yearbook wrote that he was “comedy personified, a real trouper and 3 star varsity man;” and in the 1939 yearbook, he was described as “hard playing backfield star; comic lead in ...iolanthe”.

Whitmore spent his senior year at the Choate School in Wallingford, CT on a football scholarship. He is survived by his wife, Noreen, and sons, Steve, James Jr. and Dan.

Remembering Ted Masterson

Alum paints new portrait of beloved Board of Ed President

Theodore "Ted" Masterson served on the Amherst Board of Education for 32 years, most of those years as its president. He was much loved and respected by teachers, administrators, staff and students alike. When he retired in 1975, his devotion to Amherst did not end. The sincerity of his dedication was manifested daily in visits to the halls and numerous activities at the school. His compassionate understanding of youth, his marvelous capacity for listening, and caring about his student friends enriched the quality of life at Amherst for many.

The Class of 1984 honored Masterson with a portrait and a plaque outside the high school auditorium, which was named in his honor "Ted Masterson Auditorium."

The plaque reads:

*Theodore L. Masterson
October 5, 1894 - March 5, 1984*

Theodore Masterson loved Amherst and its students. "Young people," he said, "they're just as grand today as they ever were and it's a joy to be their friend."

He was truly our friend in word and in deed. He represents the spirit that is Amherst High. He will be with us always. In his memory we dedicate this auditorium.

Sadly, the portrait of Mr. Masterson was damaged by sunlight and water when the auditorium roof leaked. In June, 2007, Cathy Brown, chair of the Art Department at the high school, sent an email to Ellen Marshall informing her of the condition of the picture. The high school decided to go ahead with any recommended restoration. Unfortunately, Cathy and her students were unable to restore the picture.

However, one of Cathy's students, Jared Reisweber of the Class of 2007, decided he would do a replica of the picture as an original oil painting.

After Jared spent many, many hours on the portrait, it was unveiled at the Board of Education Meeting on December 17, 2008.

There was an audible gasp from the parents, students and community members in attendance when the damaged picture was shown and the new portrait was unveiled. Jared truly captured the spirit and personality of Mr. Masterson in this beautiful painting. A special thank you also goes to John Klepfer, also an Amherst grad, of Frame and Save in Snyder, for the beautiful frame that adorns the picture.

A check was presented to Jared on behalf of the Amherst Alumni Foundation for this very special gift and his unselfish dedication to making this project a reality.

Grant monies support various programs, students in 2008-09

This year has been a busy year for the Grant Committee, which awarded \$5,000 in grants to support various programs, students and teachers. The committee consistently awards grants that benefit the most students in the Amherst Schools, as well as individual grants to deserving students. They include:

■ A grant to Paul Biddle, Middle School Orchestra Director, to have his musical composition for a brass quintet published. The piece was dedicated to the students at Amherst Central School District and is available for performance by the students.

■ Funds were also provided to the Smallwood and Windermere Elementary Schools for their musical theater productions.

■ A grant was awarded to two high school students who overcame tremendous personal and educational obstacles over the past several years. The students participated in the

VisionQuest College Experience, which is a program that has college students reach back into their communities and mentor high school students from their hometown throughout their four years of high school. The two college students who were the mentors for this year's participants were involved in the 2007 CIA Leadership Workshop that was funded in part by a previous grant from the ACAF.

■ Additional grant awards include money for books on strategies for classroom management for at-risk children, and funds for two middle school students to attend the Wegman's Culinary Teen Camp.

Each grant application is carefully reviewed by our Grant Committee and has to meet certain criteria in order to be awarded. These grants would not be possible without the generosity of you, our alumni. We encourage follow up from our recipients in the form of pictures or an article. At the March 12 Alumni Foundation Board meeting, Betsy Hughes, recipient of a Student Ambassador Grant from the ACAF, presented an informative slide show of her trip to Europe last summer where she met government leaders and learned about daily life in other countries.



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

The job of Class Director can be as involved as the individual wishes to make it. And each class is not limited to just one person; many classes have as many as two or three people who perform this service.

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Stone Tigers finally take up residence in front of High School

After more than a year of planning and preparation, the long-awaited Stone Tigers project came to completion this past September with the support and hard work of many alumni and friends. Two beautiful stone tigers, designed by local artist and sculptor Larry Griffis III, were permanently installed during 2008 Homecoming weekend.



The pewter-color tiger mascots flank the front staircase at AHS and can be seen easily from Main Street. They are a 75th anniversary gift to the district from the Amherst Central Alumni Foundation, Inc.

Delivery and installation of each 1,200-lb. tiger went smoothly thanks to the collective efforts of Griffis, alumni project manager Cindy Oppenheimer '72, Dave Dengler '74, and the AHS

custodial staff. Dengler arranged for the forklift that transferred each sculpture from Griffis' truck to its permanent location at the high school. The tigers' arms and tails were delivered separately, and Griffis and his crew spent the afternoon applying the finishing touches.

The sculptures were cemented to their respective platforms, and have been secured in place to withstand the elements and students. From the moment the tigers called Amherst High School their new home, these stately felines immediately earned the respect of visitors students. AHS Principal Gregory Pigeon made the occasion extra-special by circulating *The Legend of the Amherst Tigers* to the student body.

School officials, alumni, parents, and students were on hand for the formal dedication held September 26 as a prelude to Amherst's Homecoming football game that evening. The Sweet Sixteen and Varsity Singers choral groups, under the direction of music teacher Justin Pomietlarz, provided a perfect ending to the program by singing the Alma Mater. 


**The Hayloft:

High school courtyard undergoes a transformation

What was once a plain courtyard with a few springtime daffodils has blossomed into a beautiful, year-round garden at the high school thanks to the combined efforts of AHS students and faculty. Thanks to everyone who helped, we now have a glorious inner courtyard!

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
2008 REUNION WRAP-UP
