

FRANK AND JUDY HARDING

My dad and mom were the quintessential Amherst Alumni - graduating in 1946 and 1947 respectively, they were still in touch with many of their old Amherst buddies when they died in July 2011 - four days apart.

Judy Leonard and Frank Harding grew up blocks from each other in Eggertsville - shared many of the same friends and saw many of those friends marry each other - just as they did in 1951. My mom attended Harlem Road School (now the Harlem Road Community Center) and my dad Eggert Road School (now the Cantalician School). High School sweethearts, they were married for over 60 years. My father's brother, Bill '44, married one of my mom's best friends - Irene "Sis" Becker '46 in 1953. Ironically, Aunt Sis passed away just two weeks after my mom and dad. Bill Harding is alive and well living in Bethlehem, PA.

My parent's embraced Amherst life - both were popular and active - dad played football, baseball (his passion) and basketball and my mom participated in synchronized swimming and drama club. But my favorite story was of her "Home Economics" skills when

she snuck her unfinished pillowcases out from class under her sweater and took them to her best friend's (Betty Spangenthal '46) housekeeper to have her finish them....mom's lack of sewing skills was legendary and inherited by me and by her granddaughter, Sarah Joyce Genau '97.

Coming back to their beloved Amherst when I was a student was always a joy to them and when Sarah graduated, they were so thrilled to be part of three generations of Amherst High School grads, including my husband Bill Joyce'68. They went to all their class reunions and attended many of the all class reunions of the past 30 years. They lived within the shadow of the tower for nearly 60 years before moving to Williamsville in 1989 (I know they never rooted for the Billies....). They had high hopes that their great-grandson, Will Genau, would carry on the tradition and be generation #4!

They were one of the first supporters of the track and field construction project in 1999 and they faithfully supported the annual alumni golf tournament - and in their memory, I am proud to donate \$5,000.00 to the Alumni Class Challenge and Fund Drive recently announced by the Alumni Foundation - this gift goes to the decade of the 40's and hopefully will help boost them into the next round! My mom and dad would have been the first to step up to the plate.

Their community spirit and love of Amherst and their dear Amherst friends will always be remembered by those who knew them - and I hope will be an inspiration to all past and future Amherst graduates.






Hung throughout the first floor of the high school, there are various artworks that were added to the permanent collection of ACHS over the years.



GLEN OAK


Glen Oak is conveniently located on Smith Road between Transit Road and Millersport Highway, just 25 minutes from downtown Buffalo.



DIRECTIONS FROM NEW YORK STATE THRUWAY


